We begin choosing heaven or hell here on earth. Whenever we get a good feeling from helping someone else, or enjoy something beautiful in nature, we get a taste of what heaven is like. And, whenever we are dissatisfied with our life, feel jealous of others or want bad things to happen to them, we know what hell is like. We need to develop an appetite for heaven by learning what God wants us to do and not do.

When people die, they wake up in the spiritual world feeling safe and happy, and go on living forever. Death is only the beginning of a new life.

Everyone who lives will someday die. We wonder what will happen after we die. Is there really a life after death? What is heaven like? Hell? How can I get to heaven? Why would I end up in hell? What are angels? . The New Church offers many new ideas about this.

In the Bible God tells us that our lives will continue after death.

"But concerning the resurrection of the dead, have you not read what was spoken to you by God, 'I am the God of Abraham, the God of Isaac, and the God of Jacob'? God is not the God of the dead but of the living." Matthew 22:31-32

What happens when you die?

All people are born to become angels after they die, because God loves everyone and wants them to live forever with Him in heaven. Emanuel Swedenborg's Writings tell us a lot about what it's like to wake up after we die, what heaven is like, and what hell is like. The world we go to after death is called the "spiritual world."

What is the spiritual world like?

Imagine someone who has died waking up in the spiritual world. He or she wakes up feeling safe, healthy, and happy and is greeted by angels; maybe even someone they know. At first the person thinks they are still in this world, but soon realize that it's the spiritual world. Life appears to be a lot like it was on earth, but slowly it becomes clear that the spiritual world is even more real.

During their stay in the world of spirits, people continue their preparation for either heaven or hell which was begun on earth. This choice is up to each individual - it is not decided by God. While God invites everyone into heaven, and deeply hopes we will choose to be with Him, He allows us to make our own decision in freedom. Jesus said:

"In My Father's house are many mansions; if it were not so, I would have told you. I go to prepare a place for you."

John 14:2
